

## **SETH OPPENHEIM**

Seth Oppenheim is currently a Policy Advisor in the Regulatory Affairs Department of the Institute of International Finance (IIF) based in Washington, DC. The IIF is the world's only global association of financial institutions, numbering more than 380 members. Mr. Oppenheim is helping to coordinate an industry-led *Committee on Market Best Practices*, which aims to resolve the current financial market turmoil.

Mr. Oppenheim came to the IIF from the International Criminal Court in The Hague where he was a lawyer in the Office of the Prosecutor, working on the prosecutions of rebel leaders in the Democratic Republic of the Congo for human rights crimes. Mr. Oppenheim was a Robert Bosch Foundation Fellow in 2004-2005 where he worked in the Office of the Legal Advisor of the German Federal Foreign Office in Berlin. Following his Bosch year, he was twice selected as a Fulbright Scholar; first to Austria and then to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) where he worked on legal issues relating to the restitution of cultural property and the protection of cultural heritage in armed conflict.

Mr. Oppenheim holds a J.D. from the University of Michigan; an M.A. in International Studies from the University of Vienna; an M.A. in Political Science from the University of Michigan; and a B.A. in Political Science from the University of Michigan. As a law student, he worked in the Office of the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia where he participated in the prosecution of Slobodan Milosevic. He is a native of the Detroit, Michigan suburb of Huntington Woods.
