Philip Suttle is the new Director of Global Macroeconomic Analysis at the IIF in Washington DC. Mr. Suttle has had a long career as a global macroeconomist, with a specialization in emerging markets. For most of his career, however, he was at JP Morgan, where he helped build Morgan's global economic research effort.
